The book is interactive with a mobile app available through the Google Play and Apple stores. The app allows users to follow Mass in over 15 languages, and contains all the basic Catholic prayers, very useful in a world where we are always on the go. An accompanying manual helps youth leaders to sit down with others to discuss faith-related questions and search for answers together.
